Mt. Carmel Expands its Outreach



As client needs grow, so does Mt. Carmel's outreach to service members, veterans and their families in the Trinidad and Pueblo areas. Virtual service delivery is already in place, however, over the next few months Mt. Carmel will have a physical presence in both of these regions. Bob McLaughlin, Mt. Carmel's COO, has been meeting with city officials, community representatives, partner agencies and veteran organizations to finalize the expansion plans, and the support has been tremendous. McLaughlin explained, "There is a significant military community

in both Trinidad and Pueblo with a real need for what Mt. Carmel delivers every day in Colorado Springs. By establishing a presence and leveraging our resources, we're going to be able to help a lot of the veterans and their families that call these areas home." In Trinidad, Mt. Carmel will stand up its operation in the Champions Building downtown, while in Pueblo, the team will establish an office in the St. Mary-Corwin Hospital.

Behavioral Health Update

Our Behavioral Health Team has been hard at work serving our military community! We were very excited to host our annual Bar NI Couples Retreat. The Cabot family graciously funded this retreat, which was located on their magnificent property. We are so grateful for their generosity! This is the first retreat we have been able to accomplish since the COVID pandemic. Our couples rated high satisfaction, and measurements showed increases in connectedness scores.

In addition, we have been providing presentations and participating in awareness events on Fort Carson. We have also formalized our next steps in our Suicide Prevention Initiatives! Mt. Carmel



staff and volunteers are trained in a response engagement for any clients who utilize Mt. Carmel and who are dealing with suicidal ideation. We are hoping to ask 'the question' that will help all of our clients get connected with support if they need it. We are continuing to engage in Suicide Prevention Initiatives and legislation to reduce suicide in our community! Our Behavioral Health director, Kirsten, testified in support of Senate Bill 129, which has a suicide prevention focus. We have experienced an influx of behavioral health needs in our community over the past months. In order to serve more people, we have expanded our number of offices and screeners. Our next step is to hire more licensed providers.





Partner Spotlight: Eye Love Care, Inc. Veterans Optometry Partners of America (VOPA)

Eye Love Care, Inc. is an optometry company that provides eye exams and glasses to veterans and Medicaid patients throughout Colorado. Veterans Optometry Partners of America (VOPA) is a division of Eye Love Care, Inc. and has been a partner of Mt. Carmel Veteran Services Center since July 2019. Our partnership with Mt. Carmel has allowed us to service over 5,000 veterans here in the Pikes Peak region. Being able to plug in to the array of services Mt. Carmel offers has allowed our veteran patient base to receive assistance beyond their eye care needs. We have veterans who come in for an eye exam and have never been to Mt. Carmel. When they realize all the free programs available aside from eye care, it opens a new page for them. We are very happy and proud to join Mt. Carmel's mission to be a Beacon of Support!

In addition, we are expanding our services to Medicaid patients! Patients don't have to be a veteran to take advantage. We recently rolled out our "Eye Love Program" where patients 21 years and older with Medicaid insurance receive a FREE pair of glasses following an eye exam. Medicaid covers the exam with a \$2 co-pay, and patients under 21 years will receive a covered eye exam and covered glasses. 
